Q.33. Azad Hind Fauj was a unique organization. The extra ordinary work of Subhash Chandra Bose and his Azad Hind Fauj had a very deep impact on the Indian people. He uttered the slogan 'Delhi Chalo'. There were huge demonstration all over the country. Q.34. Hydro electricity is generated by fast flowing water, which is a renewable resource. India has a number of multipurpose projects like Bhakra Nangal, Damodar valley corporation, the Kopili Hydel Project etc. producing hydroelectric power. Thermal electricity is generated by using coal, petroleum and natural gas. The thermal power stations use non renewable fossil fuels for generating electricity. (geo ch-5,p-52)

Q.37. In the towns of civilization, two mounds are often found in the east and west directions. The residential area was situated on the east mound and fort was situated on the west mound. These towns were equipped with ramparts. The turrets were built on the defense ramparts. The main road divided the town into five or six blocks. The main roads in Mohenjodaro were 9.15 metre wide and the streets were 3.0 metre wide on average. The drains of the houses led to the big drain on the side of the road. Then the water was drained out of the town through these drains. The drains were mainly made of paved bricks. The drains were covered with bricks of large size. Residential and community buildings are also found in the Saraswati-Sindhu civilization. The houses of rich people also had wells and toilets. Evidence of stairs in building is

also found. Granaries, baths and meeting halls are found in community building.

The administration of the Egyptian civilization can be explained as follow:

- Pharaoh (King): Pharaoh had unlimited rights. He was an Autocratic ruler. All the powers of governance were vested in his hands.
- Wazir: He used to help the Pharaoh in governance. His main function was to collect taxes and to keep records of income and expenditure.
- Military organization: It was based on feudal system. Later Pharaoh built a permanent army.
- Local government: The administration of the villages was in the hands of feudal lords who had the powers of police and justice. In cities, there was an administrative officer who used to maintain peace and collect revenue.
- The empire was divided into many provinces.
- Pharaoh was the chief justice. (His ch-2, p-14)

Q.38. a) Dams were traditionally built to impound rivers and rainwater that could be used later to irrigate agricultural fields but today they are used for electricity generation, water supply, flood control, recreation etc. Many uses of the impounded water are integrated with one another.

b) Regulating and damming of rivers affect their natural flow causing sedimentation at the bottom of the reservoir, resulting in rockier stream beds and poorer habitat for the rivers' aquatic life. Dams also fragment rivers making it difficult for aquatic fauna to migrate. The reservoirs created on flood plains submerge the vegetation and soil leading to its decomposition.

- a) The denudation of the soil cover and subsequent washing down is described as soil erosion. It is caused by natural forces like wind, glaciers, and water and human activities like deforestation and overgrazing.
- b) Ploughing along the contour lines can decelerate the flow of water down the slopes. It is called Contour ploughing. Steps can be cutout on the slopes making terraces. Terrace cultivation restricts erosion. Large fields can be divided into strips. Strips of grass are left to grow between the crops. This breaks the force of winds. It is known as Strip cropping.

Q.39. The constitution provides a three-fold distribution of Legislative powers between the Union Government and the State Governments which are as follow :

- Union list includes subjects of National importance, such as Defense, foreign affairs, banking and currency. We need a uniform policy on these matters throughout the country. The Union Government alone can make laws relating to the subjects mentioned in the Union list.
- State list contains subjects of State and local importance, such as police, trade, agriculture and irrigation. The State Governments alone can make law related to these subjects.
- Concurrent list includes subjects of common interest to both the Union Government as well as the State Governments, such as education, forests and trade unions.

OR

Federalism is a system of government in which a power is divided between a central authority and various constituents of the country.

Some of the key features of Federalism are :

- There are two or more levels (or tiers) of government.
- Different tiers of government govern the same citizens, but each tier has its own Jurisdiction in specific matter of legislation, taxation and administration.
- The fundamental provisions of the constitution cannot be unilaterally changed by one levels of government.
- Courts have the power to interpret the constitution and the powers of different level of government.
