In this world some accept their plight with grace and overcome the hardships related to it by developing tastes and habits. But Derry could not find a way out of his disability of burned face. Gradually ,he developed a sense of alienation. He wanted to escape from the world. His sneaking into Mr. Lamb's garden when he saw none around is an example of escapism.
