Digital literacy – the ability to use technology critically and responsibly – has become as essential as traditional literacy in the twenty-first century.

The challenge, therefore, is not to reject technology but to develop a healthy and balanced relationship with it. Schools, families, and policymakers must work together to ensure that technology serves human well-being rather than undermining it.
