This is evident from a painting depicting 'The Court of Muhammad Qutb Shah'. In this artwork, circular lines are drawn in blue against a light blue sky. White parapets (Munder) and lattice windows (Jali-dar Gavaksha) are crafted atop the buildings. Patterns of flower-sprays/vines (Boote) are beautifully detailed on doors.	2

This marked the birth of the Pahari Style. The role of King Sansar Chand is notable in its growth.	2
