

Previous Knowledge Assumed:

Students may have knowledge of whom do we call a foreigner.

Previous Knowledge Testing:

5 E	Teacher's Activity	Students' Response
Engage	To inculcate interest among students, a PPT having images of Messi, Ronaldo, Narendra Modi and Barack Obama will be shown to them. Then the teacher will ask them to identify these personalities.	Students will identify these personalities as they are very popular.
Explore	After identification, the teacher will make a question: How can you say these celebrities are different from us?	They are different from us as they belong to a different country.
	Can we call them foreigners?	Yes, all are foreigners except Mr. Modi .
	Would you believe that no man is a foreigner and no country is strange.	Is it possible? How can we say so?

Announcement of the Topic:

To satisfy the curiosity of the students, the topic will be announced by the teacher:

" Today, we are going to read a very beautiful poem 'No Men Are Foreign' by James Kirkup. The poet believes in oneness of mankind."

Explain	* The teacher will explain the meaning of each textual line, key words and poetic devices.	* Students will listen carefully explanation of the poem, note down meaning of all keywords and understand all the poetic devices used in the poem.
	Explanation of the Poem:	
	The poet asks us never to forget that people living in other countries are not strange. Under their different	

types of clothes, all human beings are same. We all live and breathe in a similar manner. We walk upon the same earth. We shall meet the same earth in the end when we shall be buried in it after death. All the people of the world are fed by natural elements like sun, air and water. They also enjoy the harvests in their peaceful time. They also fear starvation caused by long wars. They also work hard to earn their livelihood and their destiny is similar to ours.

All people sleep and wake up in the same manner. They too can be won over by love. Their experiences of life are similar to that of ours. Whenever we are asked by our leaders to hate other people, we must remember that we ruin our own life. We would condemn ourselves to a life of enmity. Whenever we are involved in war, we pollute our earth. The deadly weapons pollute theenvironment. So we must remember that no human being is foreign and no country is strange. Thus the poem gives us a message of universal brotherhood and peace.)

POETIC DEVICES

A. Alliteration:

1.'a single body breathes'

(b sound is repeated at the beginning of each word)

2. Or sleep and strength

(s sound is repeated)

B. Metaphor:

Beneath all uniforms a single body breathes

C. Repetition:

The word 'remember' is repeated five times in the poem to convey the message that we all are equal.

SHORT SUMMARY
