General Instructions:

- 1. There will be an Annual Examination based on the entire syllabus.
- 2. The Annual Examination will be that of 80 marks and 20 marks weightage will be given for Internal Assessment.
- 3. For Internal Assessment:

The Periodic Assessment will include:
